# Preface

For two decades now, the International Institute of Social History has organized the European Social Science History Conference. It was originally inspired by the example of the meetings of the American Social Science History Association and motivated by the idea that in Europe, too, there was a great need for social scientists and historians to talk to each other (especially in an age when the “cultural turn” seemed all-conquering). Over the years the ESSHC has more than doubled in size (it now regularly attracts more than 1200 participants) and it has become one of the most important biannual fixtures in the calendar of historians and social scientists alike.

The system of thematic networks, which organize series of panels, seems to be working very well and is an accurate reflection of the way we at the IISH see our own work and our role in the historical community. The IISH is, of course, primarily known for its huge (over fifty kilometers) and unique collections on social movements from all over the world, but for twenty-five years now it has had a research department as well. This unit, with some thirty members and twelve tenured researchers has managed to become quite influential with its agenda of “global labour history”, but we have always seen the mission of our researchers as more than just producing articles and monographs.

Organizing networks, workshops and conferences for us is a way to involve a much larger community in our work than a relatively small institute could maintain on its own. Ideally, the IISH research department fulfills the role of a catalyst, bringing together scholars in collaborative networks and setting up shared data infrastructures – and thus starting chain reactions.

Therefore, the relationship between the ESSHC and the IISH is a reciprocal one. The ESSHC not only is a service the institute provides to the field. It is also the kind of environment that allows the research at the IISH to prosper. Above all, of course, it is a marketplace of ideas, in which conversations are continued and started and in which people are inspired. That it continues to flourish, this time in Glasgow, is primarily due to the work of the conference organizer Els Hiemstra and our colleagues at the IISH secretariat, Astrid, Ineke and Yvonne. On behalf of the institute, I extend my heartfelt thanks to them and a warm welcome to all of you.

# The ESSHC

## Character of the ESSHC

The European Social Science History Conference aims at bringing together scholars interested in explaining historical phenomena using the methods of the social sciences. The ESSHC takes place bi-annually: in 1996 in Noordwijkerhout, in 1998 and 2000 in Amsterdam, in 2002 in The Hague and in 2004 the conference crossed the border and took place in Berlin. In 2006 we returned to Amsterdam, in 2008 the conference took place in Lisbon and in 2010 in Ghent.

The conference is characterized by a lively exchange in many small groups, rather than by formal plenary sessions. The Conference welcomes papers and sessions on any topic and any historical period.

## Sponsored by IISH

The European Social Science History Conference is sponsored by the International Institute of Social History (IISH), an institute of the Royal Netherlands Academy of Arts and Sciences. The IISH was established in 1935 as an independent, neutral and scholarly institute to house collections on social history, mainly on the history of the labour movement. In the period 1935-1940 attention was focused on saving material from all over Europe. In this period a large part of the archival legacy of Marx and Engels was saved, next to Bakunin manuscripts and the records of the CNT and the FAI from Spain. In more recent decades, the institute became a safe haven for records from Latin America, the Middle East, China, India, South-East Asia and Africa. Apart from these archives, the IISH houses a large library on Social and Economic history and a research department, dedicated to writing Global Labour History. We invite all participants to attend the general meeting with a brief report on the ESSHC and a special lecture by Prof. Christopher J. Berry, on

### **Adam Smith: Opulence, Freedom and a Moral Economy**

A student records Smith professing in his lectures at Glasgow University that ‘opulence and freedom’ were the ‘two greatest blessings men can possess’. This positive linkage of opulence with freedom is central to Smith’s vindication of commercial society and thence of modern liberty and its realisation in an economy imbued with moral values. In the Wealth of Nations he made it clear that the ‘wealth’ lay in the well-being of the people. This covered not only their material prosperity (there is nothing noble about poverty, it is a miserable condition) but also their moral welfare (individuals should have the freedom to pursue their own interests in their own way). In the Moral Sentiments he made it clear that humans possessed a disinterested concern with the happiness of others. It was a proper task of government to provide, through the rule of law, a framework for opulence to be attained and to enable all its citizens, through the provision of public works, to enjoy the liberty to lead a life of their own choosing.

Put together this is the view that comes to be called liberalism. In effect, liberalism valorises the mundane. As a mundane liberal, Smith’s ‘economy’ is ‘moral.’

**Christopher J. Berry** is Professor (Emeritus) of Political Theory and Honorary Professorial Research Fellow at the University of Glasgow. He has established himself as a leading international scholar of the Scottish Enlightenment. In addition to seminal articles, and contributions in this area, he is the author of the key text *Social Theory of the Scottish Enlightenment* (Edinburgh, 1997), which is shortly to appear in both Japanese and Chinese translations. His scholarship ranges more widely. The author of six books in total, his *Idea of Luxury* (Cambridge, 1994) has had widespread influence both outside and inside academia and appeared in a Chinese translation (Century Press, 2005). The quality of his scholarship was recognised by his election at his first nomination to Scotland’s ‘national academy’ – the Royal Society of Edinburgh. He is currently editing a large volume of original essays on Adam Smith for Oxford University Press and writing a book *The Idea of Commercial Society in the Scottish Enlightenment* for Edinburgh University Press.

## Internet access

The University of Glasgow has many WiFi hotspots throughout Campus. We suggest that you access this service using **Eduroam** or access the internet using a mobile **Dongle** device. Both solutions require you to prepare your equipment prior to arriving in Glasgow.

**Eduroam** is a secure, world-wide roaming access service developed for the international research and education community. This has to be issued in advance at your 'home' institution. At the University of Glasgow it is provided as a broadcast wireless network available wherever there is wireless coverage.

A **Dongle** is a hardware key for the software you're using. It allows mobile broadband by connecting your laptop or netbook to the internet.

If you do not have access to either of these solutions you can set up a "GUvisitor" wireless network account, you must be able to run the Cisco Clean Access ActiveX web client or Cisco Clean Access Java Applet web client in order to authenticate. Currently many devices including iPhones, iPads and Blackberries are unable to operate using this solution.

**Rail:** Intercity links to all major cities. Frequent services to Edinburgh (50 minutes) and London (5 hours). There are two city-centre terminals, Queen Street and Central (served by Buchanan St and St Enoch underground stations respectively).

**Coach:** Buchanan Bus Station is the main terminus for long distance coaches.

**Road:** From Carlisle, Newcastle and the south, exit M74 on to the M73, joining the M8 at the Old Monkland junction. M8 exits for the University are J18 if travelling from the south, Edinburgh and the north and J19 if coming from Glasgow Airport and the west. Other main routes serving the University include Great Western Road (A82, north of campus), Clydeside Expressway (A814, south) and Byres Road (B808, west). Car parking on the University campus is not permitted and it is extremely difficult to find a parking space in the surrounding area.

## Transport within Glasgow

**Buses:** Routes 11 and 44 run through the main campus from the city centre. Numerous other routes serve Dumbarton Road, Great Western Road and Byres Road. A seasonal tourist route stops at the University.

**Underground:** The main station for the University is Hillhead. Kelvinhall and Kelvinbridge stations are more convenient for some locations.

**Local Trains:** The nearest suburban rail station is Partick, about one mile to the west of the University. It has an interchange with the underground and with bus services on Dumbarton Road.

**Taxis:** Black taxi cabs can be picked up at most times in the University area and the city centre.

## Museums

On the university campus there are several interesting museums: the Hunterian Museum, the Hunterian Art Gallery, the Zoology Museum and The Mackintosh House.

Other museums in Glasgow include:

### **Riverside Museum: Scotland's Museum of Transport and Travel**

Glasgow's well-loved Museum of Transport has relocated to this spectacular waterfront landmark that was designed by internationally-renowned architect, Zaha Hadid. The Riverside Museum is her first major public building in the UK. The dynamic new Riverside Museum displays Glasgow's rich industrial heritage, which stems from the River Clyde. The Tall Ship is berthed alongside the Museum, creating a fantastic experience in this stunning setting. Visitors can relax and enjoy the riverside views in the Museum's café, and take home all manner of transport-related gifts from the Museum's shop.

### **Kelvingrove Art Gallery and Museum**

Kelvingrove has 22 themed, state-of-the-art galleries displaying an astonishing 8000 objects. The collections are extensive, wide-ranging and internationally-significant. They include: natural history, arms and armour, art from many art movements and periods of history, and much more. They even have a real Spitfire! And a magnificent organ.

The RBS Exhibition Gallery and the community exhibition space both have a running programme of temporary exhibitions and displays. Please note that some temporary exhibitions are subject to an entry fee.

### **St Mungo Museum of Religious Life and Art**

The award-winning St Mungo Museum explores the importance of religion in peoples' lives across the world and across time. The venue aims to promote understanding and respect between

people of different faiths and of none, and offers something for everyone. You can find out more about some of the world's major religions, and the story of religion in the west of Scotland. St Mungo Museum regularly hosts temporary exhibitions and a variety of events, from family-friendly activities to talks relating to religion in Scotland today. The museum sits across from Provand's Lordship - the oldest house in Glasgow - and alongside the medieval Glasgow Cathedral.

### **Scotland Street School Museum**

Scotland Street School was designed by Charles Rennie Mackintosh, Glasgow's most celebrated architect, and Scotland Street School was a functioning school up until 1979. It is now a museum, telling the story of school education in Scotland over a hundred years, from the late 19th century to the late 20th century. The building is a wonderful example of Mackintosh's architectural style and the displays include a Mackintosh room where you can study the architect's designs for the building. You can also see what school days were like in the reign of Queen Victoria, during World War II, and in the 1950s and 60s, in our three reconstructed classrooms. The museum regularly hosts temporary exhibitions and fun family events.

### **The People's Palace**

Get a wonderful insight into how Glaswegians lived, worked and played in years gone by. In the adjacent Winter Gardens you can wander among the exotic palms and plants or enjoy a coffee or lunch at the café. Outside, you can admire the restored Doulton Fountain and relax in the attractive surroundings of Glasgow Green, the oldest public space in Glasgow.

## **Shopping**

Glaswegians call it the Style Mile. If it's fashion you like, you will enjoy the many shops in Buchanan Street, Argyle Street and Sauchiehall (Saw-kee-hall) Street, the Buchanan Galleries, St. Enoch Centre or the architectural gem of Princes Square.

Royal Exchange Square, Ingram Street and the Merchant City provide not just nice shopping but also great restaurants, café's and bars.

In the West-end near the university there are many nice smaller shops on and around Byres Road.

You can virtually 'eat your way' around the world in Glasgow as the city's restaurant and café culture encompasses the entire spectrum of dining and eating. Recent accolades celebrating the city's culinary credentials include Curry Capital of Britain – which Glasgow won for the fourth time – and several of the city's restaurants came top in their category at the 2010 Scottish Restaurant Awards, including Mother India, Osteria Piero, Nanakusa, Di Maggio's and Hotel du Vin.

So whether you prefer dining out on locally sourced, organic ingredients; ethnic cuisine, or the very latest in fusion cooking, you'll find something to suit your taste. Make sure also to enjoy an aperitif in Art Deco splendour at one of Glasgow's most fashionable bars or a post-dinner dram in the more traditional surroundings of one of the city's 'whisky' pubs.
